With hands-on training, real-world race involvement, and elite instructors from top-tier teams, MTS prepares students to step directly into professional motorsport operations.

Courses are delivered over 8 weekends (Friday to Sunday), making it ideal for students who are working full-time or enrolled in college. Unlike traditional programs, MTS delivers practical, hands-on training directly in pit settings, garages, and racetrack environments.

MTS students work on real race cars and train on real tracks. The curriculum includes live race-weekend work with Formula 4 or similar series, giving students direct exposure to pressure-driven environments. Students learn in small groups (12–30 students per course), working on real single-seaters and GT cars, with a 80%+ post-graduation employment rate.
